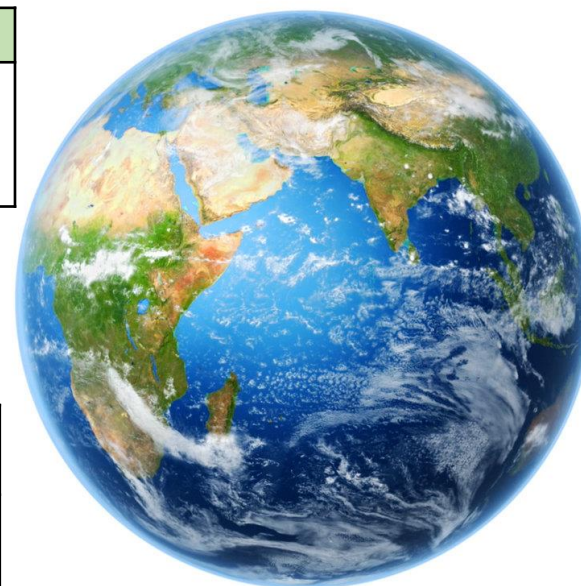
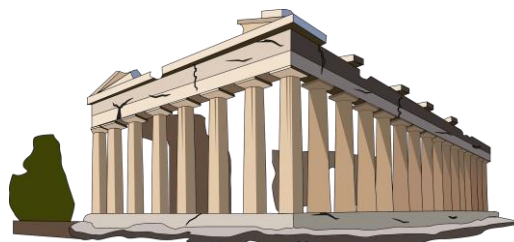
country	A nation with its own government and occupying a particular territory.
capital city	The location the functions as the seat of government for a country or region.
continent	A continuous expanse of land.
temperature	How hot or cold a location is.
boundary	A line which marks the limits of an area.
language	The system of communication used by a particular country or civilisation.
currency	A system of money used by a country.
landmarks	An object or feature of a landscape that is easily seen and recognised.
land use	The function of the land – what it is used for.
region	An area of a country or the world that has definable characteristics.
compare	The similarity or differences between topics.
Climate	The weather conditions within an area in general or over a long period.
Human Feature	Features made or built by humans.
Physical Feature	Natural features of the Earth's surface.
North, East, South West	The four compass points.

An imaginary line that runs through the center of the Earth.

What is the Southern Hemisphere?

The Southern Hemisphere is the half of the earth below the equator.



What is the Northern Hemisphere?

The Northern Hemisphere is the half of the earth that is above the equator.
