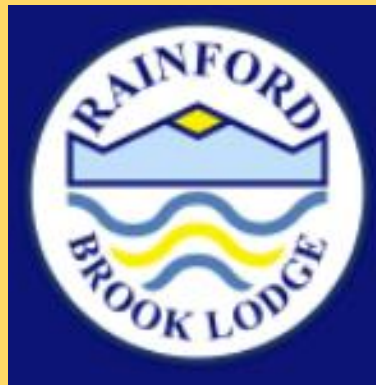

# SATs Timetable

In 2022, Year 6 SATs week will take place on the week beginning Monday 9th May. The SATs tests will take place throughout the week, starting on Monday 9th and ending on Thursday 12th May.

Date	Test
Monday 9th May 2022	Grammar & Punctuation test - 45 minutes Spelling Test - 20 minutes
Tuesday 10th May 2022	English Reading Test - 60 minutes
Weds 11th May 2022	Mathematics Arithmetics (Paper 1) - 30 minutes Mathematics Reasoning (Paper 2) - 40 minutes
Thurs 12th May 2022	Mathematics Reasoning (Paper 3) - 40 minutes
Friday 13th May 2022	No tests today

# SATs Marks

Test	Maximum marks available for each test. Raw scores will be converted to Scaled Scores.
<b><u>SPAG = 2 papers</u></b>  Grammar & Punctuation Spelling Test	50 marks 20 marks  <b>Total</b> 70 marks
<b><u>Reading = 1 paper</u></b>  Three texts that increase in demand throughout the test	<b>Total</b> 50 marks
<b><u>Maths = 3 papers</u></b>  Paper 1 – Arithmetic Paper 2 – Reasoning Paper 3 – Reasoning	40 marks 35 marks 35 marks  <b>Total</b> 110

# SATs Scaled Scores

**120** – This is the highest score a child can get in the KS2 SATs.

**110-119** – Any score above 110 (including 120) means that a child has exceeded the expected standard in the test and is working at a **GREATER DEPTH**.

**100** – This is the expected standard for children (and essentially means a 'pass').

**80-99** – Any child that is awarded a scaled score of 99 or below has not met the expected standard in their KS2 SATs.

# When are Year 6 SATs Results released?

Although the SATs dates for 2022 are in May, the test results are not released until towards the end of the summer term (July). This is because even though the SATs tests are taken within the classroom, they are marked **externally**. We then have some time to go through papers and look for errors.

Once the results have been returned, parents are given a report that shows their child's raw score (the actual number of marks they got), their scaled score (which allows for comparison with all other children across the country who took the same test), and whether or not they have achieved the national standard.

How to tell children

# SATs – How are they used?

- Used nationally to determine national standards (but no league tables published this year)
- Used to determine achievement and attainment of pupils (scaled scores and cohort progress scores)
- Passed to high school to help determine targets and initial groupings
- Used to help judge relative strengths and areas to improve in a school

# SATs – What's in it for the children?

- Shared experience
- Great chance to learn, revise and consolidate key skills ready for secondary school
- Sense of pride in working towards a goal
